Ambassador Parent Program Introduced for School Year 2017-2018

he Northwest Ohio Scholarship Fund is getting some assistance this year connecting and engaging with its new Ambassador Parent Program. This past fall NOSF asked school principals at four of its partner schools to recommend a family or two to help with the new program. The four schools each had 20 or more NOSF scholarship students attending their school this year.

The NOSF Parent Ambassador serves as a spokesperson for the NOSF program and shares with others what the scholarship has provided for their family. Ambassadors serve as hosts at NOSF school visits, provide families information about the program, and connect families in the community to resources that strengthen and support NOSF. The ambassadors serve a one-year term that can be renewed each year. They are also available for

media interviews and provide quotes where needed.

The response has been great. Parents were happy to help. NOSF has enlisted parent ambassadors for *Christ the King School in Toledo, St. Aloysius Catholic School in Bowling Green, Delphos St. John School and Mansfield Christian School.*


