



Fair Provides an Opportunity to Visit Schools Virtually

On January 30, families had an opportunity to learn about different educational options in the comfort of their homes by participating in the Northwest Ohio Scholarship Fund Virtual School Choice K-8 School Fair. This third annual event, which is normally held at the Franciscan Center, was presented on the last day of **National School Choice Week**.



Registered families were sent a link before the fair to enter the virtual school fair and to participate using their cellphone, computer or tablet. Once logged into the event, they could visit individual school breakout rooms and speak directly with representatives from the schools. It provided a great one-one opportunity without having to personally visit the schools.

There were 30 different schools represented including Catholic, Christian, independent, charter, public and magnet as well as a few Homeschool parents who shared their experiences. NOSF had a breakout room for information about their need-based scholarships and **School Choice Ohio** provided information on the different state-funded vouchers including EdChoice.

Ann Riddle, Executive Director of NOSF said of the fair, "One thing that the COVID-19 pandemic has shown us is that school choice is very important to families. The Northwest Ohio Scholarship Fund is excited to present its annual school choice school fair virtually during National School Choice Week and bring those choices to parents in the comfort of their homes."

NOSF partner schools will be having their own March Madness from March 15 through March 19 with **NOSF Slam Dunk for Scholarships**.

This week-long fundraising event will assist NOSF in providing need-based scholarships for children. The 56 schools that have students attending with a NOSF scholarship will be asked to help raise funds. Schools can set their own goals for the challenge or compete with one another.

Each day NOSF will share the total raised on social media and highlight some of the participants. NOSF is leaving it up to the schools how they want to participate in the event. This event will have its own fundraising page where parents or the school can directly make donations for the cause.

The Northwest Ohio Scholarship Fund has been providing scholarships for students to attend private schools since 1999. Over 16,400 students have received a need-based scholarship for tuition or homeschool expenses since that time.

More Families Eligible Thanks to Expanded Income Guidelines

For the 2021-2022 school year, new and returning families with household incomes that fall at 300% or below the National School Lunch Household Income Guidelines will be eligible to apply for a NOSF scholarship. This means that a family of four with a household income of \$78,600 or below would be qualified. At the December 2020 NOSF Board meeting, the Board approved the change in eligibility for families.

NOSF Board member Scott Brown said of the change, "The increase in income eligibility simply allows more families to choose the right school for their children. NOSF is all about the parents making that choice and this will help fulfill that mission."
